916 Ink is Sacramento's arts-based creative writing nonprofit that provides workshops for Sacramento area youth, grades 3 – 12, in order to transform them into confident writers and published authors. Their workshops increase literacy skills, improve vocabulary, teach empathy, positively impact social and emotional learning, and expand communication skills. Since 2010, 916 Ink has transformed over 3,000 young people in the greater Sacramento region into published authors and published over 100 professional anthologies of student work.

Crocker Art Museum's Block by Block arts engagement initiative focuses on enhancing community life and cultural participation in Sacramento's Promise Zones, which span from Del Paso Heights in the north, to portions of downtown and Oak Park to El Paraiso Estates in the south. Block by Block co-creates with youth art experiences that affirm the value of the arts, support youth voice and achievement, and most importantly, build channels for community connectivity and bonding. Through Block by Block, the Crocker has engaged more than 30,000 community members and 400 artists, and employed youth who either live or go to school in the Promise Zone.

La Familia Counseling Center, Inc. (La Familia) provides multi-cultural counseling, outreach and support services to low income, at-risk youth and families in Sacramento County. For more than 45 years, La Familia has successfully operated programs that have been recognized on the local, state and national levels. All of La Familia's services are free, and bilingual staff members are available to meet the needs of our diverse community. Featured at the Community Fun Day will be the Afterschool STEM Program and Birth and Beyond.

Powerhouse Science Center encourages families to discover science everywhere. Through hands-exhibitions, interactive demonstrations, dynamic programs, and planetarium presentations, Powerhouse makes learning about science fun and exciting — sparking curiosity and inspiration — encouraging people of all ages to explore the wonders, possibilities, and responsibilities of science.

The **Sacramento Adventure Playground** is an after-school youth development program for youth ages 6 – 15 to engage in supervised play activities free of charge (plus special dates for younger children). Sacramento Adventure Playground is powered by Fairytale Town and located at Maple Neighborhood Center. Essentially a makers' laboratory or tinkers' workshop, the Adventure Playground puts real tools into the hands of youth so they can build and create things that reflect their own ideas and visions. Youth are able to build forts, play in the mud, climb a tree, make crafts, turn junk into treasures, paint on walls, take apart motors, and even beat on an old dryer.
